




Fire drill

Pupil Parliament


The 2019-2020 Pupil Parliament has started with a bang. Some new journeys have opened up for the school these last two years such as Dementia Friendly and Peace School.

Peace School

Newly awarded as a Level 1 Peace School, Pontarddulais Comprehensive School will look to continue projects and strive for Level 2. Mrs. Bennet's work with close to a dozen pupils was our lead project, this was a cross-curricular project; Art, Welsh and History, that was based on the conscientious objectors during the World Wars. A display of their work is visible in our main hall.



This year pupils were able to visit the Welsh Assembly and discuss and learn about peace in Wales and the World.

First Give is a fully-resourced secondary school programme that gives children the opportunity to engage in a social action. First Give is beneficial to young people in terms of developing independence, organization, empathy and a sense of responsibility.

During our Welsh Bacc hours in year 9, we were given the chance to win and donate £1,000 to a charity of our choice with First Give. We worked in groups and researched social issues in our community and chose a charity that we felt was important to us, also year 9 were given assemblies on various charities. We then researched information about that charity and created a PowerPoint presentation.

Groups then presented their pitches to their Welsh Bacc teachers and they chose the best one out of each class. After that we then developed our presentations of our charities and were able to get in contact with them to learn more about their work and what the £1000 would goes towards.

In addition to this we planned and delivered social action activities by putting up posters or other ways of awareness raising in support of the charity. Finally, on the evening of May 13th we were lucky enough to be in the school final, and all year 9 groups presented a pitch to a panel of judges to try and persuade them to choose their charity. 





