

I look forward to presenting them with their Bronze awards once they have completed all their other sections.



Thank you Mr. N Llewellyn for asking us. Choir members you were outstanding!!














Goppa Community Concert

TACKLE PROGRAMME

A group of year 9 pupils have been taking part this term in the TACKLE programme run by the Ospreys. It is an Employability Programme working with young people looking to develop leadership, softer skills and understanding of further education and the workplace. Using Rugby and Sports as a vehicle to engage, focussing on Personal Career Development with Ospreys players and Industry personnel as role models. The group take part in classroom based and practical activities and have also had a session delivered by the Navy. 


STF
